

Call for Papers Online Workshop of the ESIL International Economic Law Interest Group

Interactions between Legal Orders in International Economic Law

15 April 2024

Abstract submission deadline: midnight 25 February 2024 (CET)

The ESIL IEL IG Workshop will take place on **15 April 2024** as a side-event to the 2024 Research Forum to be hosted by the Department of Law of the University of Cyprus.

The event will take place as an **online event**. Further details will follow in due course. The call is aimed at early-career scholars (i.e. those who have not earned yet a permanent position as Associate Professor).

The workshop will address the following topic:

Interactions between Legal Orders in International Economic Law

International economic law, like other fields of international law, is confronted with challenges and complexities which are caused, inter alia, by multiple legal regimes regulating international trade law, international investment law and international financial law. It can be observed, e.g., in the interactions of global, regional, bilateral, as well as national legal regulation in respect of different issues of international economic law. In addition, there are interactions between international economic law disciplines and other fields, like the well-known discussion about the interplay of international trade law and international environmental law norms. Such interactions of legal orders can, on the one hand, create obstacles, but on the other hand, they can also lead to cross-fertilisation and have a positive influence on the creation of an efficient international economic legal order.

The interest group invites submissions particularly – but not exclusively – on the following key questions:

- 1) Interaction between regional trade agreements and the WTO.
- 2) Interaction between international trade law, and/or international investment law, and/or international financial law norms.
- 3) Interaction of legal regimes within the global financial architecture.
- 4) Interaction of international economic law and international environmental law/international labour law.
- 5) Dispute settlement in the context of interaction of legal regimes in international economic law.
- 6) Norm conflicts in the context of international economic law.

- 7) Diffusion of legal norms and legal transplants in the context of international economic law.
- 8) International economic law and domestic legal systems.

Paper submission procedure

Abstracts may be submitted in English or French in accordance to the timeline as set out below. Submissions must not exceed 400 words, and have to be submitted to:

In addition to the abstract, each submission should contain a **separate file** containing information on:

- The topic of the call for papers for which the abstract is submitted;
- The author's name and affiliation;
- A short (one page) author's CV, including a list of relevant publications;
- The author's contact details, including email address and phone number;
- Whether the author is an ESIL member and the date of affiliation;
- Whether the author is an early-career scholar (i.e. those who have not earned yet a permanent position as Associate Professor).

Timeline

The deadline for the submission of abstracts is **midnight 25 February 2024 (CET).** We expect to be able to inform successful applicants by 4 March 2024.
