2022 ESIL IG WORKSHOP IN UTRECHT

The ESIL IG MigRefLaw, in partnership with the [Human Rights Research League](#) and the Italian Forum on Migration, Borders and Asylum ([IFA Forum](#)), held a Workshop on '[In/Ex-clusivity of International Migration and Refugee Law: The Rights Holders' Perspective](#)' on 31 August 2022 in Utrecht, as a side event of the ESIL Annual Conference on the "In/Ex-clusivity of International Law".

Divided into two panels, the first one discussed dichotomic approaches to migration, refugee and citizen issues, while the second focused on asylum and migration rights within and beyond borders. Presentations addressed the ESIL Conference's topic, looking particularly at the main triggers for inclusion and exclusion in the legal framework governing (forced and voluntary) human mobility.

Inspired by the high level of the papers presented and the thought-provoking debate they generated, the ESIL IG MigRefLaw is aiming for a Symposium, to be hosted on a renowned blog, which will collect contributions from the speakers willing to participate.
