

Interest Group on Peace and Security Pre-conference Workshop Call for Papers The Changing Perceptions of the Use of Force in the Contemporary World

Monday 24th April 2023 1PM - 4PM (CEST)

The 2023 ESIL Research Forum will take place on Thursday 27 and Friday 28 April 2023 and will be hosted by the School of Law of the University of Tartu in Estonia. The theme of this year's conference is "Regional Developments of International Law in Eastern Europe and Post-Soviet Eurasia". The Research Forum will be preceded by interest group workshops. The preconference workshop of the Society's Interest Group on Peace and Security is scheduled to run on 24 April. The workshop will take place in online format.

Recent high-profile conflicts including the 2008 Russian-Georgian war, the 2014 Russian annexation of Crimea, the 2020 interstate border conflict between Azerbaijan and Armenia over the occupied Nagorno-Karabakh region and the ongoing war between Ukraine and Russia have presented major challenges to international peace and security in Eastern Europe and Post-Soviet Eurasia. These regional conflicts also raise challenging international law questions of broader application, especially concerning the law on the use of force and international humanitarian law.
