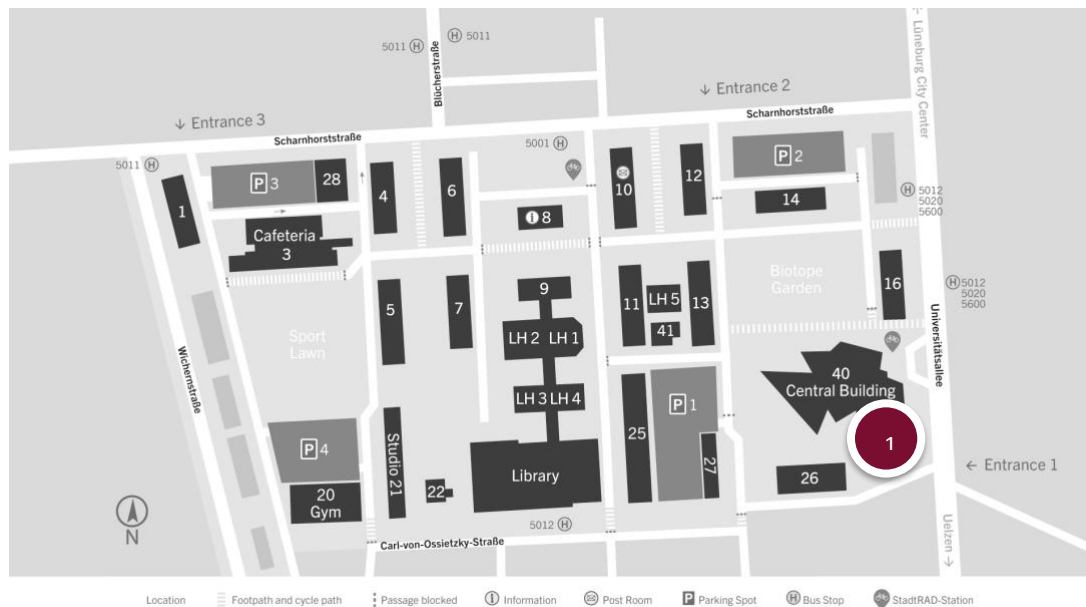
VENUE & LOGISTICS

GETTING AROUND IN LÜNEBURG

– Lüneburg central station **(1)** to Bergström Hotel **(2)**: Lüneburg train station is about 600 m away from the Bergström Hotel, within easy walking distance.

– Lüneburg central station **(1)** to Leuphana **(5)** and vice versa: Bus 5001 (Express), 5600, 5020, 5011 or 5012 commute directly and frequently from Central Station to Leuphana University Lüneburg (arriving at “Universitätsallee”, “Munstermannskamp” or “Blücherstraße”).

– Bergström **(2)** to Leuphana **(5)** and vice versa: Buses depart and arrive from “Am Sande” **(4)**, arriving at “Munstermannskamp” or at “Universitätsalle”. “Am Sande” is about 10 minutes walking distance from Bergström. Buses 5011 and 5012 commute every 15 min, bus 5020 (arriving at “Universitätsallee”) commutes every 30 min.

– Bergström Hotel **(2)** to To Huus **(3)**: It is a short 9-minute walk to the left from the Bergström over the “Brausebrücke”.

GOING TO HAMBURG AIRPORT

– From Lüneburg central station **(1)**, regional trains (RE3 or RB31) depart every hour to Hamburg Central Station. The Journey takes about 40 min. From Hamburg Central Station, switch to S-Bahn 1 to Hamburg Airport (Green Line).
